## Home Care Packages Up and Running!

Canterbury City Community Centre's Home Care Package service is now up and running! The packages are for eligible clients in the Inner West who have intermediate or high level care needs.

Gina, our Community Care Coordinator, has been busy setting up the service, contacting and visiting clients who have been referred, and developing care plans with them.

This involves discussing their individual goals and what services could assist them to achieve those goals. For example a client may have three main goals – improve management of a health condition, eat more nutritious meals and have more social contact.

A worker could visit the client and transport and accompany them to their medical appointments, assist in lunch time meal preparation by chopping the vegetables and take the client to visit a friend once a week.

Gina has also been busy recruiting new Community Care Workers to provide the service. New faces at the Centre in this role are Maddy Butcher, Kerry Ellison, Chadia Safi, Phillip Dodd, Christine Shinners and Sue Roy! They are all doing a fantastic job. We will be recruiting more staff over the coming weeks.

All our Care Workers have, or are currently obtaining qualifications, are experienced, professional and have a genuine commitment to working with older people and providing them with the best possible service. Because we know our workers, we are able to match workers to individual clients.

We also have an arrangement with organisations who can provide qualified nurses to attend to the medical needs of clients.

So far our Care Workers have visited clients to provide conversation and company; assisted with sorting out some paperwork; provided transport to hospital and other appointments; assisted with some housework; and accompanied clients to do some grocery shopping and have lunch at a cafe.We are currently assisting clients from Narwee to Annandale!
